

SCHOOL ADMISSIONS

The District shall provide a public education to all persons between the ages of five and twenty-one who have not received a high school diploma and are entitled to attend school. If such persons reside in the District, they may attend without payment of tuition.

A veteran of any age who has not yet received his/her high school diploma and who has been discharged under conditions other than dishonorable, is eligible to attend school.

A non-veteran under twenty-one years of age who has received a high school diploma shall be permitted to attend school or the BOCES upon payment of tuition.

Upon registration, all new students shall be required to present:

1. proof of date of birth.
2. record of immunizations and a health certificate from a licensed physician, and
3. proof of residency (e.g. tax bill, cable bill, mail, motor vehicle license, motor vehicle registration, public assistance documentation).

The Board further requires that all new entrants (K-12) be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian at the time of registration for enrollment in the school district. Students residing in the District, with other than their parents or legal guardians, must have an affidavit of residency approved by the Superintendent of Schools on file before entering school. These affidavits of residency have to be reaffirmed each year. Violation of the terms of the affidavit may result in disenrollment of the student.
